DISTRIBUTION OF QUESTIONNAIRES

The quantitative survey was issued to six different sectors: activists, developers, politicians, government, researchers and consultants. Please note that the figures listed below are estimated numbers.

ACTIVISTS:

In the activist sector the survey was issued to the Environmental Justice Network Forum (EJNF) for distribution to 40 of their Western Cape membership (Their total membership in the Western Cape for EJNF is 70.)

Under this section, the survey was also sent to the Wildlife and Environment Society of Southern Africa (WESSA) to about 29 of their members in the Western Cape. (Their total membership in the Western Cape is 2 000).

TOTAL: 69 people

DEVELOPERS:

In the developers section, the survey was sent to 300 Cape Institute of Architects' members in the Western Cape. (There is a total of 650 Western Cape members), 24 firms in the Association of Town and Regional Planners South region (Western Cape townplanners), 28 members of the Institute of Landscape Architects of South Africa in the Western Cape branch, 251 members of the South African Planning Institute's membership in the Western Cape, 25 members of the Master Builders Association in the Cape Town branch, a total of 155 Western Cape members of the Association of South African Quantity Surveyers, 239 members of the South African Property Owners Association and about 50 people in the Cape Town Regional Chamber of Commerce and Industry Regional and Local Issues Committee.

TOTAL: 1048 people and 24 individual firms

POLITICIANS:

In the political arena, the survey was sent to 11 members of the Western Cape Standing Committee on Local Government, Environmental Affairs and Development Planning, 18 members of the National Council of Provinces (Select Committee on Land and Environmental Affairs) and the 30 members of the National Portfolio Committee on Environmental Affairs and Tourism as well as the national and deputy ministers of the environment and the provincial minister of the environment.

TOTAL: 62 people

PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT:

In the provincial government sector, the survey was sent to 30 management members of the Western Cape Nature Conservation Board. In the Provincial Department of Environmental Affairs and Planning the survey was sent to 25 people and in the Provincial Department of Housing the survey was sent to 10 people. In the Provincial Department of Local Government the survey was sent to 9 people.

TOTAL: 74 people

NATIONAL GOVERNMENT:

In the national government, the survey was sent to 57 members of management, falling under Yako (7), Ntsengwa (50) and Kleinschmidt (15)

TOTAL: 72 people

LOCAL GOVERNMENT:

In the local government sector the survey was sent to 29 members of the Cape Metropolitan Council's housing departments, and about 26 members of their environmental management departments and 23 members of their planning sections. The survey was also sent to the Stellenbosch local municipality's engineering department (1), their housing department (3), their planning department (10) and their environmental management department (7)

TOTAL: 99 people

RESEARCH:

In the research sector, the survey was sent to 32 members of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and 30 researchers at the National Botanical Institute.

TOTAL: 62 people

CONSULTANTS:

In the consultant sector, the survey was sent to 120 members of the International Association of Impact Assessors (IAIA) Western Cape Branch, which has a total membership of 168.

TOTAL: 120 people

MISCELLANEOUS:

The survey was also sent to an activist in Plettenberg Bay and 4 students/staff of the Environmental Evaluation Unit at the University of Cape Town were invited to fill in the questionnaire.

TOTAL: 5

GRAND TOTAL: 1611 people and 24 firms 89 Questionnaires were completed, constituting a response of 5.4%
